

Mandatory Biodiversity Net Gain







So what is BNG?

Natural England definition

"an approach to terrestrial development and/or land management that aims to leave the natural environment in a measurably better state"

Natural England - Biodiversity Net Gain - more than just a number

The Environment Act 2021

Schedule A, Part 1, para 2 defines the biodiversity gain objective as being met

"in relation to development for which planning permission is granted if the biodiversity value attributable to the development exceeds the predevelopment biodiversity value of the onsite habitat by at least the relevant percentage".

The relevant percentage is defined as 10% and the Act provides for the relevant percentage to be amended by regulations by the Secretary of State.



The Environment Act 2021 BNG Framework

Amends Town & Country Planning Act (TCPA)

Minimum 10% gain required calculated using the Biodiversity Metric & approval of a biodiversity gain plan

Habitat secured for at least 30 years via planning obligations or conservation covenants


Delivered on-site, off-site or via a new statutory biodiversity credits scheme
